A note about worship for the 2025 Southeast Michigan Synod Assembly:

Worship for the 2025 Southeast Michigan Synod Assembly has been planned around the idea that all the work we do during the Assembly is an act of worshiping God. In planning worship, we sought out a format similar to what is celebrated as part of the Great Three Days (Triduum) of Easter. In the historical tradition, worship for the Great Three Days is one service that begins on Maundy Thursday and doesn't end until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. In our context, the three moments we pause for acts of formal worship are meant to be one worship service spread out over our time together, beginning Friday evening and ending Saturday evening.

From a practical perspective, the most jarring thing you may experience is that there will be no blessing or dismissal at the end of Friday's Eucharist worship or at the end of Saturday's Morning Prayer service. There will also be no call to worship for Saturday's Service of the Word. This is intentional, as it draws all the worship services together as one.

Finally, as we are moving into a season where our Licensed Lay Ministry program is being given new life, we have chosen to lift up the gifts our Licensed Lay Ministers in worship. As such, Licensed Lay Minister Paul Archer has been invited to preach for us on Friday evening and Licensed Lay Minister Robin McCants will lead us in a Service of the Word on Saturday afternoon. We chose to include the Service of the Word to provide the assembly with an experience of a worship service that does not require the leadership of an ordained pastor.
